She was born June 25, 1947 in Marshfield (Coos Bay) Oregon. Her parents were Ross & Iva Mintonye. She only had one sibling, her brother Ross. He was 11 months older than her to the day. Her father was a mechanic and her mother was a Home Economics teacher and supervisor for the cafeterias in Coquille School District. They obviously taught her a strong work ethic. But it appears the best thing they spent their time on was loving their children.

Nancy grew up in Coquille and lived in town for the first 9 years of her childhood. Later her family moved to the country. It reminded me of the Little Rascal's when she told me she was in a gang of 6 kids. All of them boys mind you. She was treated gently until she stirred things up and rough housed with them. She had to toughen up to be part of the gang. This was most likely difficult because she considered herself a Daddy's girl. She once shared with me that she was reluctant to misbehave because she never wanted to disappoint her dad.

She graduated from Coquille High School in 1965. She then attended College of Education in Monmouth. She decided that she was not ready at that time in her life. Although when I asked her what she might have changed she shared with me that she might have started College later and stayed with it. I think Nancy had other doors to open and the character to keep them ajar. She went on to Merritt Davis School of Commerce in Salem and moved to Lincoln City to work in their new hospital. Again, the door to

Salem was still ajar and she moved back a year later. She worked at Salem hospital for 3 years and then the State of Oregon for 3 years.

Nancy met Gary Grabow in 1972. He was part of a crew that was helping her move. They were married in 1975. They were blessed with a daughter named Maureen in 1976 and a son named Ross in 1978. They built a home in Independence, OR in1986. They gave their children two lasting gifts; one is roots and the other wings. They give Nancy strength and support throughout her life. She has 2 grandchildren who she visits in Coquille quite often. Her little Red Sports car that she named Baby made many trips to visit them.

She stayed home until 1980 and then hit the road driving a school bus until 1992. She also became a driver's aide riding in Special Needs Buses. If one has ever been on vacation with your children, then you would know it takes a special person to drive a school bus. She might not have finished college to become a teacher but then she would have never gifted the children on her routes. Minds are like parachutes; they only function when left open. I imagine Nancy opened many young minds with her imagination and humor.

Nancy was diagnosed with cancer and had surgery in January of 2010. Nancy retired in 2011 to take care of her husband. He died from Cancer in September of 2011. These are just 2 small sentences that cannot describe the difficulty and courage they both endured during this time. She reminds me of a quote I once read. "Be like the willow tree, able to bend without breaking under the weight of the storms that come your way".

Nancy is a member of Calvary Baptist Church. She is an active member and attends Bible Studies. Her faith must be what lightens her load and strengthens her.

She also belongs to Beta Sigma Phi and plays Trivia with her son Ross twice a week. She carries a book around and loves computer games. It makes me jealous to see a mother and a child be able to have the bond that is necessary to dine, drink and play trivia. Kudo's to them both.

Announcements

Howard Lloyd Huffman

August 5, 1923-November 1, 2019

On November 1, 2019 we lost one of our early members of our Life Story Writing group. He was a member of the South Salem Senior Center, and he was one of our World War II Veterans.

Howard Huffman was born on the family ranch to Gladys and James Huffman near Highwood, Montana in 1923. After beginning his education in a one room schoolhouse and attending several other

schools he graduated from Fort Benton High School in 1940 at age 16.

In 1941 he began his college education in the Industrial Engineering program at Montana State College in Bozeman before volunteering for the draft in November of 1943. He was severely wounded by shrapnel during the Battle of the Bulge. He was awarded a Purple Heart and Bronze Star among other awards and discharged from the Army with the of Sargent in June 1945.

On July 3, 1945 he married Jan Shoemaker and they returned to Bozeman where he completed his studies and graduated with a Bachelor of Science in 1947 and from Oregon State with a Master of Science in 1954.

Howard was an instructor of Industrial Engineer in Montana State College (now university) for 25 years before traveling and following his and Jan's son Donald Huffman and daughter Debra Huffman Sparber to Oregon in 1988. Howard is survived by his beautiful wife Jan, his daughter, his son and daughter in law and by three grandchildren and four great grandchildren. Our Life Story writers miss him.
