We have been discussing how to start up and these are some of the changes to Bingo we would be implementing:

6. We need a minimum of 15 people to start each Bingo session to offset the cost of supplies and prizes.

Is it me? Is it us? Is it them? Is it you? How long does it matter? Do we know what to do?


Before the pandemic The days felt so swift, Now time rushes by Like a leaf in the wind.


