
Happy New Year

Please continue to do so. Hopefully we will continue in 2022 .






Writers Group!

Apple Pie Taquitos

INGREDIENTS

For the Filling:


- 2 Apples peeled and diced
- 1/4 cup Brown Sugar
- 1 tsp Cinnamon
- 1/4 tsp Nutmeg
- 1 tbsp Cornstarch
- 1/4 cup Water

To assemble:

- 4 Flour Tortillas
- 2 tbsp Melted Butter
- 1/4 cup Brown Sugar
- 1/2 tsp Cinnamon
- 2 tbsp Caramel Syrup

INSTRUCTIONS

Combine all ingredients for the filling in a pan. Simmer over medium heat for 10 minutes or until apples are tender as preferred. Leave to cool slightly. Stir together brown sugar and cinnamon in a dish. Fill tortillas with apple filling and roll to close. Brush each taquito with butter then roll in the cinnamon sugar. Arrange taquitos in a baking sheet lined with parchment. Bake for 15 minutes at 350F. Drizzle caramel syrup on top of the taquitos to serve.




