At the September 12<sup>th</sup> Board meeting he gave a status report on recent completed and pending activities. Yellow striping to improve safety while walking has been completed in areas around the building; a leak at the main water source has been repaired; lightbulbs in the Bingo room have been replaced (greatly improving lighting) and new ones will soon be installed in the Dining room; Sonitrol will be on premise mid- September to update the security system; a rusted gutter on a corner of the building is scheduled to be replaced and bids have been accepted to repair a refrigerator in the kitchen and to replace degraded parts in the irrigation system backflow device (mandated to be tested annually by the City of Salem). It is dedicated volunteers like Roger, whose watchful eyes through the years have assured the Center's ongoing success.






