Members - Recycling & Rewards

Members please keep SSS in mind when you are shopping or cleaning with the following:

Rewards Accounts: We have rewards accounts at both Office Depot and Fred Meyer (Kroger grocery). If you make purchases for personal use and want to give credit for the value of your purchase towards our rewards accounts you can do so by simply giving our business phone number: 503-588-0748 to link your transaction and give credit on the SSS rewards program. We receive 1% from the purchases to go towards rewards certificate. When we make purchases at Office Depot of over a \$10.00 value and also turn in 10 ink or laser cartridges (a limit of 10 cartridges per month or 120 cartridges a year — we receive \$2 reward credit for each cartridge for a total of \$240 value just on the cartridges) — so please consider donating the expired cartridges to our Business Office. The 'rewards' certificates are available in the succeeding month that we can use towards purchases of office supplies and get a discount. At Fred Meyer, give our business phone number when you make your purchase transaction and we can receive back 'rewards' in a check when the value accumulates past \$10.00. These may be small and simple efforts to donate to South Salem Seniors and accumulate over a higher volume of purchasing. Remember your purchases are for your personal use when you buy the goods, but you convey the 'reward value' as a contribution to SSS.

Bottle Returns: Please bring to SSS your empty and clean returnable bottles and cans. For members consuming beverages from containers with deposit at SSS, please put them in the deposit return containers at SSS. SSS member Roland Held volunteers to pick them up and takes them into the Bottle Return recycling and recovers the deposit value. Those \$0.10 per container can add up quickly, i.e. 1000 containers = \$100.00.

Metal Recycling: We also recycle metals from various articles donated to us that we do not resale. Think of old appliances, pots & pans, clean tin cans, old wiring, old tools, etc. Our volunteer maintenance crew (Charlie, Dan, Mered, Arturo and others participating) break down and sort out the various metals (steel, aluminum, brass, copper etc.) and take an accumulated van loaded to Cherry City Metals for recycling and turn into cash.

Thank you for thinking of helping in these small but important ways. Recycling is also good for the environment and gets these articles where they can be re-cycled versus accumulating in a land fill. any liquid overflows. We should eat in the dining room. It just isn't the best for meeting as it's noisy, no carpet for deadening that.


Here's wishing you all a wonderful & safe holiday season. I'm looking forward to seeing your smiling faces, in January.
