Update on donations – thank you for your donations, we love them and keep them coming, but, we can no longer accept furniture. We have a shortage of space and our "manpower" is "stretched" so we've had to limit the size and weight of what we can handle. To me it's like the airlines, nothing bigger than a normal suitcase and the lighter the better (50 pounds is too much). Our workshop crew can still take some larger, metal items if they're able to break them down, cut them up and recycle the parts.

We are a very active Center with many activities, and we seem to be adding more, thank you Michi Kohlhoff. If you want to play games, socialize, add a hobby or an exercise program, come down and visit. Thanks to Kate Bayne our activities manger, for updating our activity signup sheets.

Do you have some free time and want to use your talents to help out the Center? If so, we're here to provide you with the opportunity to be a part or our volunteers. There are many places you might find attractive. One of our eminent needs is on our Board. **The Board election will be held in July. The following positions: President, Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary, Office Manager and two Directors** may be open. If you're interested in serving the center in any of these positions, the Committee would love to hear from you. There are signup forms available at the front desk and you can talk to any of the currently serving members.

To restate our policy eliminating members fees for the normal usage of our clubhouse (I think of the center as our gang's clubhouse) this does not eliminate fees for consumable items. For example we will continue to charge 10 cents per page for black and white copies and 25 cents per page for color copies.

The annual cost of membership has remained the same for many years. The board has proposed increasing the membership to \$25 annually with a corresponding increase in our lifetime membership. This is a reminder that the increase will be considered and voted on at the May membership meeting. FYI, in a meeting with other area Senior Centers our proposed increase to \$25 is in line with many of the other centers and significantly less than some. Also, consider that we're open 5 days a week and that we are a totally volunteer run facility with many fun and interesting free activities for members throughout the week.


Nifty Thrifty will no longer be able to accept anything we cannot sale in our two rooms or lobby displays.




