

Hello Fellow Members

This month's important message - "And what is so rare as a day in June? Then, if ever, come perfect days." by James Russell Lowell and immortalized here in the South Salem Senior Center's newsletter. I'm looking forward to a month of perfect days.

It's almost perfect here at the Center, if only we had a volunteer graciously step forward and run for the coveted Office Manager position. We've been lucky enough to have wonderful volunteers come forward and run for all of other open positions – President, Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary and 2 open board positions. Do you have some free time and want to use your talents to help out the Center? If so, we're here to provide you with the opportunity to be a part or our volunteers. There are signup forms available at the front desk and you can talk to any of the currently serving members.

Through April, the first 8 months of the our fiscal year, we're approaching 10,000 volunteer hours. I know that when the numbers for May are added in we should be approaching 12,000 because of all the additional hours volunteers put in for our Spring Rummage Sale. And, wow did it pay off. The proceeds from the sale was a few hundred dollars shy of \$10,000! Evidently this is the best sale's result since before COVID.

Since the annual cost of membership has remained the same for many years, the board proposed increasing the membership to \$25 annually with a corresponding increase in our lifetime memberships. The increase is in line with many of the other local area centers and significantly less than some, especially since we're open 5 days a week as a totally volunteer facility and, since we've eliminated member's fees for the normal usage of our clubhouse facilities. Approval of this increase required a vote at our quarterly Membership Meeting in May. The increase was unanimously approved and will become effective when our new fiscal year starts September 1st. There is a complete list of the breakdown, by age (younger member's lifetime memberships cost more), of the new lifetime membership costs at the front desk. Bare in mind that current rates are good until the beginning of September.

We are a very active Center with many activities, and we seem to be adding more all of the time. If you want to play games, socialize, add a hobby or an exercise program, come down and visit. Later in the Newsletter you'll find a schedule of activities. Or, perhaps you want to add an activity, if so, come down and we'll see what we can do.




Happy Father's Day from the Nifty Thrifty Staff!




